### **Athletic Fields & Facilities Update**

Funding has been approved by the Griswold Board of Finance for a design plan for the multipurpose track and field behind Griswold High School. Alan Carpenter of CPH Design in Attleboro, MA—who designed Killingly's athletic facilities—will perform the design work in order to move on to the next phase.

The multi-use track and field will include an 8-lane track that would be suitable for state-wide competitions; a new turf field to be used for high school and youth football, soccer and lacrosse; and new, energy-efficient LED Lights that will be outside of the track perimeter and will not obstruct view from the stands.

The existing track and field are in disrepair due to

drainage issues and age, and will first be completely demolished to lay the new track and turf field.




Just For Fun! Peter Parker or Principal Palonen? GHS celebrated Spirit Week ahead of Spring Break. Superhero Day was a big hit!
