TLI also popped into Mrs. Arieta's 4th grade math class, where students have been working hard and recently took part in Question Formulation Technique (QFT) group work.







### **WOLVERINES FORWARD NEWS**

Wolverines Forward (WF) is a Before & After School Program for students in grades PreK-8 that started in the fall of 2021. The program is now serving 61 students in the morning, and 75 students in the afternoon.

As the weather gets nicer, WF plans to spend more time outdoors with students! Kindergartners and 1st graders will explore rainbows and springtime flowers with science and art projects; 2nd graders will be starting a gardening unit, discovering the importance of bees, and exploring ecosystems; 3rd and 4th graders will be focusing on cultural exploration of South America and European countries. Our GMS students will be using recycled materials to make multiple science and art projects, including jewelry. The A.M. program will continue offering rotating free choice center activities along with beautiful spring-themed crafts.

### **A**LUMNI PROFILE: MIRANDA MAHONEY '96

If you're from Griswold, you may know Miranda (Nagle) Mahoney's grandfather, Mr. Norman Gileau, who served as Principal of Griswold High School for three decades (1959-1989). Today, in the midst of the nationwide "great resignation," we find that loyalty to any one job or place of employment is very rare. However, Griswold Public Schools is not just any place. GPS has seen great loyalty from faculty and staff, especially those who grew up in Griswold or transplants that made the small town home for their family.

Although Miranda may not work for Griswold Public Schools, she has become a dedicated community partner in her work as Program Coordinator at Griswold's prevention coalition known as <a href="PRIDE">PRIDE</a> (Partnership to Reduce the Influence of Drugs for Everyone).

"After graduating from UCONN, I started in the substance use prevention field and haven't left," she noted. "I've worked with many towns and coalitions throughout eastern Connecticut, but Griswold has always had my heart. When the opportunity to help my hometown came, I jumped at it." Griswold PRIDE has flourished under her leadership since it began in 2015.


"Miranda has made a huge impact in the region," said State Representative Brian Lanoue. "She is truly out doing God's work." The two have testified together in front of the CT Public Safety & Security Committee in Hartford three times (2019-2021), achieving growth in the CRISIS Pilot Initiative program with CT State Troopers stretching across eastern Connecticut and beyond.

Miranda is also an active voice in Griswold Public Schools' District Partnership Advisory Council (DPAC), aiming to help in the prevention of vaping for minors, educating parents to obstruct minors' access to marijuana and alcohol, providing Narcan trainings and resources for those affected by the opioid epidemic, and more.

Some of Miranda's favorite memories at GHS were homecoming pep rallies, powder puff football games, and contributing to three Quinebaug Valley Conference Championships with the Girls' Basketball team (QVC merged into the Eastern Connecticut Conference, ECC, in 2000). Miranda recently moved back to Griswold after 10 years in CT's "quiet corner;" she and husband Chad Mahoney '01 made it a priority to raise their two boys as Wolverines.

"The relationships and friendships I built at GHS have been the most important asset to me, personally and professionally." Miranda noted growing up in a small town isn't always easy, with everyone knowing everyone and each other's business. However, the friendships she made are still going strong today, and relationships with her GHS teachers (some still teaching today!) helped her build her network within the school district and town. "My job is based on who you know, so when we had to start recruiting members and community leaders for Griswold PRIDE, my history with the town made it easy."

I'm sure Miranda's legacy and heart, much like her grandfather Mr. Gileau's, will still be talked about long into the future.
